# Site diff module

- The purpose of this module is to "diff" two Drupal sites by comparing some defined structures (partitions).
- Currently supported partitions
  - modules & core
  - system variables
  - latest node
- After the selected partitions have been compared, Site diff generates an output with differences highlighted.



### Site diff

Site diff allows you to compare two Drupal installations. You need to specify a **connection** to the remote site and select some **partitions** that Site diff should compare.

- or remote vs. remote site
